



Taking the bus is always faster than walking by foot. But it is a nice walk of about half an hour from the railway and central bus station to the lab. First you'll meet the *Bondgenotenlaan* (1, Avenue of Confederates) - with nice shops. In the middle of the *Bondgenotenlaan* you will see the statue of the Flemish philologist, historian and founder of Neostoicism Justus Lipsius (1547-1606, 2). On the end of the *Bondgenotenlaan* you enter the *Foch Square* (3, named after the French Marshal from World War I Ferdinand Foch). You can see a statute called "Fonske" picturing student life in Leuven: drinking beer and studying courses. If you leave the *Foch Square* on the left side of the St. Peter's Church (4) you can admire the beautiful town hall (5, one of the nicest examples of Late Gothic in the Low Countries). A visit to the St. Peter's Church is also recommended for its beautiful altar. From the city hall you walk to the *Brusselse Straat* (6, Brussels Street), leaving the *Parijs Straat* (7, Paris Street) at your left. When you pass by the St. Peter's Hospital (8) you take the first street left: *Kapucijnenvoer* (9, Trade of Capuchins). You enter the St. Raphael Hospital at number 33. Take the right entrance and follow the hallway to the elevators. The labs and offices are completely situated on the 5th floor, the meeting rooms are situated on the 6th floor. Please report yourself first to the secretary on the 5th floor.
